Army CID Names Special Agent for Key Position

Fort Belvoir, Va., April 2, 2010 – As part of a major transformation of U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command to meet new and emerging challenges associated with the GWOT, CID recently announced the selection of CW5 T.L. Williams as the CID Command Chief Warrant Officer.

Brigadier General Colleen McGuire, the Provost Marshal General of the Army and CID Commanding General announced her selection of CW5 T.L. Williams to fill this critical position on the Special Staff, as the senior technical and policy advisor for felony criminal investigative operations and investigative support programs.

Williams is currently the Regimental Chief Warrant Officer at the U.S. Army Military Police School at Fort Leonard Wood, Mo.

“I was surprised to get the news,” said Williams. “To go from the USAMPS Regimental Warrant Officer to the CID Command Chief Warrant Officer is a great honor ... I look forward to starting the job.”

Williams will be the first Special Agent to hold the singular title of Command Chief Warrant Officer, a move that Brig. Gen. McGuire said is “critically important to the future success of CID.” “CW5 Williams will balance the Special Staff by providing the same level of insight and oversight for CID Warrant Officer Special Agents that my Command CSM does for CID Enlisted Special Agents.”

According to CID officials, the CCWO billet was created out of the Army Training and Leader Development Panel Report of 2002. In her new role, Williams will be charged with advising the CID Commanding General and senior leadership on trends and



challenges associated with professional development of Special Agents, benching the command with Interagency and Multi-National law enforcement agencies, integrating new investigative technologies, and sustaining the force over the next decade. She will also assess and advise on other issues related to training, retention and readiness.

Williams joined the Army in 1984 as a light wheeled vehicle mechanic; in 1988 she joined the Military Police Corps. In 1990 she joined CID and her first assignment as a special agent was at the Fort McPherson CID Office. Since then, she has served in a number of capacities stateside and overseas including protective service officer, team chief, assistant special agent-in-charge, assistant operations officer, assistant MACOM policy branch chief, MACOM policy branch chief, commander, and operations officer.

Her awards include Bronze Star Medal; Defense Meritorious Service Medal; Meritorious Service Medal (3 Oak Leaf Clusters); Joint Service Commendation Medal; Army Commendation Medal (1 Oak Leaf Cluster); Army Achievement Medal (4 Oak Leaf Clusters); Driver/Mechanic Badge; Parachutist Badge and the Office of the Secretary of Defense Badge.

“I selected Chief Williams from among a field of highly respected and capable senior warrant officers within CID,” said Brig. Gen. McGuire. “Chief Williams brings with her a wealth of knowledge and experience as a leader, Soldier, and Special Agent. She is an outstanding warrant officer who represents the best in CID’s legacy and future.
