**CID Warns Public, Seeks Assistance**

## **Attempted Child Abduction Case**

**QUANTICO, Virginia, Oct. 7, 2015** – The U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command, commonly referred to as CID, is warning the Fort Hood community and encouraging anyone with information about a recent kidnapping attempt on Fort Hood, Texas, to immediately contact law enforcement.

The attempted abduction of a Soldier's minor child occurred on Oct. 1, between 5:00 and 6:00 p.m. in the Montague Village on-post housing area on Fort Hood.

The suspect is described as a 30-40 year-old-male, possibly of Hispanic descent, approximately 6 feet tall and 200 pounds, dark hair (possibly brown) and brown eyes (see artist depiction above).

### **Add 1-1-1**

The suspect was seen driving a white panel maintenance van which contained no roof rack for holding pipes or ladders, etc.

Individuals wishing to remain anonymous will be honored to the degree allowable under the law and the information will also be held in the strictest confidence allowable under the law.

No additional information is being released at this time to protect the integrity of the ongoing investigation.
