Evan Huelfer graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1987 and was commissioned as an Infantry Officer. His military assignments include: Rifle Platoon Leader, Mortar Platoon Leader, and Battalion Assistant Operations Officer with the 7th Infantry Division (Light); Brigade Assistant Operations Officer and Commander of the Long Range Surveillance Detachment (LRSD) in the 1st Infantry Division; Assistant Professor of Military History at the U.S. Military Academy at West Point; Strategic Plans Officer in the Coalition Forces Land Component Command (CFLCC) C-5 Plans Section; and Chief, Combat Arms Branch, Forces Command (FORSCOM) G-3/5/7 Force Management Division.

Upon retirement from active duty, Dr. Huelfer became a Department of the Army Civilian and initially served as Deputy Division Chief of the FORSCOM G-3/5/7 Force Management Division. Upon promotion to GS-15 in 2008, he became Chief of the FORSCOM G-3/5/7 Force Documentation Division and then subsequently Chief of the FORSCOM G-3/5/7 Readiness Division. He currently serves at the Defense Forensic Science Center (DFSC) as Chief of Plans & Operations for the Forensic Exploitation Directorate (FXD) as well as its Deputy Director.

He led a platoon into combat during Operation Just Cause in Panama in 1989 and commanded four Joint Task Force Six counter-narcotic missions along the U.S.-Mexican border. He led the initial campaign plan writing effort for the invasion of Afghanistan (Operation Enduring Freedom) in 2001 and was the main architect and lead planner for the land invasion of Iraq in 2003 (Operation Iraqi Freedom).

Dr. Huelfer has earned Master's and Doctorate degrees in History from the University of North Carolina. He taught Military History at West Point as an Assistant Professor and has published several books and articles. He has lectured in the U.S. and internationally, to include at the prestigious U.S. Army School of Advanced Military Studies (SAMS) and at the Canadian Command & General Staff College. He is a graduate of the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College.

His awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Combat Infantryman Badge, Expert Infantryman Badge, Parachutist Badge, Pathfinder Badge, Air Assault Badge, and Ranger Tab.
