INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY:

(U) This is an Operation Enduring Freedom Investigation.

(U) This office was notified by the Joint Casualty Assessment Team (JCAT) Insider Threat Cell, Kabul, Afghanistan, of an insider attack.

(U) Investigation determined RAFIQULLAH fired upon coalition forces during an outdoor briefing resulting in the death of MG GREENE and the injury of 15 other coalition members consisting of American, British, German, and Afghan service members.

(U) Preliminary autopsy results on MG GREENE revealed he died of multiple gunshot wounds to the head, leg, and back. The injured coalition service members sustained gunshot wounds to the

torso and extremities. All are expected to recover, with the exception of an American Soldier who sustained a gunshot wound to the lower back, resulting in paralysis.

(U) MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Chief of Administrative Law, United States Forces-Afghanistan (USFOR-A), Bagram Airfield, APO AE 09354, concurred with the findings of this investigation.

(U) Further investigation determined several exhibits were improperly classified and the subject and victim entities improperly identified as Protected Entities. All entities have been properly identified and classification issues corrected.

(U) This report was generated to flag the subject as deceased.

(U) This office was notified by the Joint Casualty Assessment Team (JCAT) Insider Threat Cell, Kabul, Afghanistan, of an insider attack.

~~(S//REL)~~ Investigation determined RAFIQULLAH fired upon coalition forces during an outdoor briefing resulting in the death of MG Greene and the injury of 15 other coalition members consisting of American, British, German, and Afghan service members.

(U) Preliminary autopsy results on MG Greene revealed he died of multiple gunshot wounds to the head, leg, and back. The injured coalition service members sustained gunshot wounds to the torso and extremities. All are expected to recover, with the exception of an American Soldier who sustained a gunshot wound to the lower back, resulting in paralysis.

(U) MAJ ~~(b)(6)(b)(7)(C)~~ Chief of Administrative Law, United States Forces-Afghanistan (USFOR-A), Bagram Airfield, APO AE 09354, concurred with the findings of this investigation.

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Forensic Science Officer (FSO), 502D MP BN CID, Bagram Airfield, Afghanistan, APO AE 09354 (BAF) was notified of a possible insider attack that killed one General Officer and injured several other individuals.

About 0100, 6 Aug 14, FSO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) arrived at Kabul International Airport (KAIA) and linked up with Dr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) ISAF Joint Command (IJC), Kabul, Afghanistan. Dr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) briefed FSO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) on all aspects of the investigation.

About 0750, 6 Aug 14, FSO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and Dr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) visited KAIA hospital to identify the five individuals treated in that facility:

1. LTC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C)
2. SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C)
3. DODCIV (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (Army)
4. DODCIV (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (Navy)
5. CPL OR4 (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (UK)

About 0900, 6 Aug 14, FSO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) conducted a death scene verification at the Afghanistan National Defense University, Camp Qargha, Afghanistan. FSO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) exposed photographs of the area and walked through the area. The scene was sanitized by the Afghanistan National Army (ANA); therefore, no evidence was collected for analysis.

About 1035, 6 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) both of this office, interviewed BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Afghanistan National Army (ANA), who stated the purpose of the meeting with MG GREENE was to discuss water storage and capabilities of the camp. BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated the event started about 0930 and involved three separate locations inside the camp. BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated there has not been enough water at the camp for the cadets going through military training at the location. BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) explained the movement of the party through the camp by drawing a map. BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated everything appeared to be "okay" and normal as they transitioned to the different locations. BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated location 3 was a very small area located next to the Military Police headquarters. BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated he heard gunshots and people started falling to the ground. BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) did not see where the gunshots were coming from or who was shooting, but he believed there were 10 to 15 rounds fired at the group.

About 1100, 6 Aug 14, FSO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Dr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) US Army Counterintelligence, Joint Field Office Afghanistan (JFOA), Kabul, Afghanistan, interviewed ANA Soldier (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated he was on duty that day and was told to clean the area in anticipation for a VIP visit. Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) cleaned the area and stayed to welcome the guests and then walked back toward the barracks. Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) saw the board and easel set up for the presentation and then sat at the ECP shack. He stated he was sitting with the Garrison Commander's driver, (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) platoon leader.) Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) saw RAFIQULLAH and three other individuals exit a Ford Ranger and enter the barracks building.

with a weapon because RAFIQULLAH was part of the security team. Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated RAFIQULLAH was an ANA soldier who was assigned to the eastside CP to provide security and had been at this location for approximately 3-4 months. He stated RAFIQULLAH was a good guy without any bad habits, who was from Paktiya Province. Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) did not know from which village.

About 1250, 6 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) coordinated with Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) CI Analyst, Kabul International Airport (KIA), who provided statistics of personnel injured during the incident at Qargha on 5 Aug 14, which included two killed (one US and one Afghan [attacker]), five in critical condition or "A" (two US, one UK, one Afghan, one Unknown), three in moderate condition or "B" (one German, two Unknown), and seven with minor none life threatening injuries (four US, three Unknown). All Class A and B injuries were transported to BAF for treatment, while Class C were treated at KIA or on scene and released.

About 1300, 6 Aug 14, FSO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Dr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) son of (b)(6)(b)(7)(C). He stated he was on duty at Garrison at 1000 and returned at 1200.

Agent's Comments: FSO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was called out of interview to attend debrief of COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) lead investigator for ANA CID.

About 1330, 6 Aug 14, FSO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Lead Investigator, Afghanistan National Army, Criminal Investigation Division, Afghanistan. CW3 (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) US Army CI, and several other JCAT members were also in attendance.

- COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated two of RAFIQULLAH's friends, (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) were detained by ANA CID for interrogation. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated he would interrogate both before he would consider allowing American Soldiers access to the individuals. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated RAFIQULLAH joined the ANA approximately two years ago. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated both RAFIQULLAH and (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) watched porn films and spent a lot of time masturbating and possibly had a sexual illness.
- (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was from the Mongul tribe, Jaji District (Zazi District). RAFIQULLAH was from Para Kyhel Village in Jany Kyhel District. They were not friends prior to assignment together. RAFIQULLAH arrived approximately 7 months ago in Nov 13. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated his investigators were gathering information on RAFIQULLAH's family.
- COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated the ANDU had two incidents in the past. One was when a British Soldier beat up an ANA soldier and the Brit was shot.

Agent's Comments: COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) ended the interview as one of the detainees escaped by jumping out of a window and ran away.

DETAILS

About 1435, 6 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) German Air Force, who stated he arrived at the camp about 0940 on 5 Aug 14, and the event started at 1000. BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated the party arrived at station 3 at around 1200. This portion of the event was supposed to be part of station 2 but was moved by the direction of COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Director, CSTC-A/CJ Engineer, ISAF. BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated they were at station 3 for approximately 10 minutes before the attack occurred. BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated there were approximately 15 to 20 people in the group, and the attacker fired at the middle of the group with approximately three bursts; however, he was unsure of how many rounds were fired. BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) knew of the event approximately 7 to 10 days prior to the actual event. BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) did not see anything out of the ordinary and he did not see the shooter. As they were evacuating the camp, BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) observed several ANA Soldiers smiling and laughing as they were walking.

About 1600, 6 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), who stated he had knowledge of the event approximately 24 to 48 hours prior to the event occurring. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated he travelled to this camp many times as PSD for COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and this was his second day in a row travelling there. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated as soon as he arrived he had a bad feeling about being there. Due to the added security and live fire ranges occurring during the event, he became nervous. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated there were more ANA Soldiers present than normal during this event. For most of the event they were out in the open with no cover. The first station had hills with live fire ranges being conducted on them, directly behind station 1, and pistol ranges being conducted on the West side of the camp. There was a lot of ANA Soldier at station 2, and this also made him feel uneasy. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) remained in the car for the first two events, but due to his Sergeant becoming sun burned, he opted to get out of his vehicle for the third station. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated he had a bad feeling as soon as he got out of the car. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) could not explain why he had a bad feeling, but the ANA Soldiers were giving him weird looks. There were multiple ANA Soldiers walking into and out of the building where the attack came from and words being chanted over a loud speaker. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated it was not a call to prayer, as it was not singing but chanting. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated it was five words that were repeated multiple times, and as soon as the chanting stopped the attack occurred. When the attack occurred, SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was hit in the left shoulder. He immediately hit the ground due to the force from the shot to the shoulder. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) immediately pulled an UK Colonel to the ground and sat on him to protect him since the UK Colonel did not have any body armor. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) then returned fire with his M-4 and his M-9. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was hit 8 or 9 times in multiple places throughout his body. As he was sitting on the UK Colonel he took an additional 4 or 5 rounds in his chest, but the rounds were stopped due to his body armor. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated he could not see who was shooting, but he could see a silhouette in the window where he believed the gunshots were coming from. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) believed the attack was planned. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated there was a contractor that was released from his contract the week prior for stating he had more workers than he actually had. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated there was a separate contractor who was told about the event, due to him having to attend and explain what his contract was. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) heard this information while he was standing guard during a meeting, and the man who ran the meeting was Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (NFI).

About 1640, 6 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed SCPO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) MG GREENE's Senior Enlisted Advisor, who stated the party moved throughout the camp to the different locations. SCPO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) saw an ANA Soldier standing guard near a hut that was by a water tank, which the respective party was looking at. When the party left that location, SCPO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) saw the same ANA Soldier and a photographer, who she believed was an Afghan local national, walk to the other side of the hut to take photos. SCPO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) heard chanting over a loud speaker and it was repeated approximately five times. It was not a call to prayer, because it was not singing. It was distinct spoken words. SCPO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) heard the shots, was hit in her lower extremities, and went to the ground. SCPO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated there was a brief pause in the gunfire, at which time she attempted to get up and move to MG GREENE who was down on the ground, but she was pulled back down to the ground by a unknown civilian. The photographer was a little taller than she was. He was "chunky", had a dark colored polo shirt, dark colored cargo pants, and a baseball hat, which she did not remember the color. The photographer had a professional looking camera with a large lens attached.

Agent's Comments: SCPO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was in a significant amount of pain and emotional distress and could not provide specific details about the building where the attack came from. SCPO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) provided a picture of the building, taken on her personal phone of the building where the shooting came from.

About 1705, 6 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) this office, interviewed 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) DOD ID# (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) C Company (Task Force 2 Fury), 2nd Battalion-501st Parainfantry Regiment (2-501st PIR), 2nd Brigade Combat Team (BCT), 82nd Airborne Division (ABN), ISAF, who stated he was assigned as Protective Service Officer (PSO) for MG GREENE. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated his team went to the site the day prior and conducted a recon of the area they were scheduled to visit. The area where the shooting occurred was not designated as a briefing venue until someone set up an easel and started to brief the attendees once they returned from an underground bunker. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was watching MG GREENE, while his team leader SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (NFI) was roaming the area around the large horseshoe that formed around the briefer. The group was approximately 10-15 meters from the building. During the briefing MG GREENE was less than 10 meters from the building. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) immediately took cover behind a concrete wall and tried to assess where the shots originated when the shooting occurred. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) believed MG GREENE was one of the first individuals who went down after the shooting started. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) did not identify the shooter, but once the shooting started, he rushed over to MG GREENE and assessed his injuries. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) noticed a gunshot wound to MG GREENE's neck. MG GREENE was loaded up into a vehicle and moved to a pre-designated landing zone (LZ). 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated they called in a MEDEVAC request and when the helicopters approached, he noticed they were flying to a different location and not the one his team marked with smoke. They continued to perform first aid on MG GREENE, at which time 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) noticed what he believed was another gunshot wound to MG GREENE's back. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) related the group moved to another LZ set up by Camp Qargha. During that time, MG GREENE was seen by a British doctor before he was placed on a helicopter and transported to BAF. MG GREENE showed no signs of life the entire time he was being treated after the shooting. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was not aware of any guardian angels, other than the PSD units, but he was aware that the Danish were providing

security at all the venues, which included two snipers on the rooftop of the building from where the shooter fired. (See Canvass Interview Worksheet for details)

About 1745, 6 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Combined Security Transition Command, who stated he heard about the mission approximately a week prior to the event. The first station was a site overview of the entire camp. MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) observed an ANA range where there were M-16s with approximately 20 active lanes. There were approximately 20 ANA Soldiers waiting to fire on the range after the current firers completed their shooting. MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated there was a lot of security present at the camp. Everything appeared normal with the exception of an ANA Soldier whose cell phone kept going off during the event. The ANA Soldier would back away from the crowd to take the phone calls and he would not brief anybody after the phone calls. At one point the party was walking along a fence and MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) observed a group of people gathered across the street, who were watching them. MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) heard chanting on a loud speaker, which appeared to come from the South of the incident location, and it was approximately 20 minutes before the attack. MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was facing away from the building when the attack began as was MG GREENE and MG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C). MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was struck in the buttocks and began to run to cover. MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) felt he was being tracked by the shooter as he was running. He saw the wound on MG GREENE's head, which was a smaller hole, so he believes the shooter was using an M-16. MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) did not see where the shooting came from. Whoever set the event up arranged the times to accommodate MG GREENE. MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated he thought the attack was planned, due to the cell phone usage by the ANA Soldier, the group that had gathered to watch them, and the chanting. MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated MG GREENE was in charge of Planning and Acquisitions and provided resources and funds for the ANA. MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated they "took out the money guy." As they were leaving, MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) saw several ANA Soldiers walking unarmed, and appearing nonchalant.

Agent's Comments: The ANA Soldier who was using the cell phone was later identified as 2LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Aide. 2LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was identified by MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) while at the hospital.

About 1745, 6 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed CPT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Aide to MG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) who stated they arrived with the rest of the party around 0945, 5 Aug 14. CPT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated the party went to three stations where there were presentations. The first station overlooked the entire camp. At the second station, there were ANA cadets firing on the range, which was located behind them. When they arrived at the 3rd station, Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was giving a presentation. CPT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) noticed an unarmed ANA Soldier who was alone and dressed in BDUs, wearing cross rifles on his uniform. The shooting started around 1200, at which time CPT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was struck in the abdomen and left arm. After he was shot, CPT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) ran for cover into the building closest to him (the building where the shooter was located). Once he entered the building, CPT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) sat in a corner until a Danish Soldier entered the building and escorted him to safety. When CPT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) exited the building, he looked for MG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) but he was already evacuated. CPT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) only heard the shots being fired and did not see where they came from or who was shooting.

About 1945, 6 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) CSTC-A. CJ-ENG, ISAF, who related he, MG GREENE, and the rest of CJ-ENG were at Qargha about a week ago because of on-going water issues. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) related Unified Training Advisory Group (UTAG) British Supervisors (NFI) identified the problems with the water, and related the Qargha Compound needed more water in order to operate efficiently; however, his team identified there was enough water there for the Qargha Compound to operate and only required usage guidelines, consumption, and water pressure fixes. There were three different Afghanistan Military Schools in Qargha, which were designed to operate separately with different water sources; however, they were currently all running jointly off the same water source. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) UTAG, Qargha (NFI), COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) MG GREENE, and several other Colonels drafted a Water Share agreement, and decided to meet on 5 Aug 14 to discuss the water issues and present the agreement. They all met at Qargha around 0945, 5 Aug 14, by the Helipads. It was common practice to remove body armor to demonstrate trust in the Afghanistan Security and Army Forces, so all the senior ranking officials, including COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) MG GREENE, and MG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) removed their body armor and left them in a vehicle. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) related they then had two briefs near the Helipads, and traveled in their vehicles to the Qargha water tower. Once they arrived at the water tower, they had another brief about the water issues. Then, they walked to the next brief, which was adjacent to the Main Gate of the Qargha Compound. They traveled through a building along a barbed wire fence. Near the main gate, COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) noticed two Afghanistan Soldiers talking, but they did not have weapons. There was another Afghan Soldier manning a stationary weapon on top of a two story building, along with Danish Security Personnel. After the water pressure briefing, they departed, and a final brief was given around 1145, 5 Aug 14. After the final briefing, an Afghan General stepped forward to shake the speaker's hand when the gunfire began. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) immediately dropped to the ground and saw MG GREENE sustain an injury and fall. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) related MG GREENE appeared to sustain a head wound, so he immediately went to MG GREENE's aid and started to perform life saving measures. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was checking for signs of life and discovered MG GREENE was none-responsive, had no pulse, and was not breathing. Due to COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) previous experience as a Medical Examiner, he knew MG GREENE was in serious condition. When ILT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) came forward, they started to move MG GREENE out of the area. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) believed he observed SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) step forward and engage someone in the window. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) believed it was almost noon when the incident happened, and at first no one knew where the gunfire was coming from. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) initially believed the rounds were coming from the roof. He observed rounds first strike the ground ahead of everyone. After the rounds hit the dirt, people started to get hit to include MG GREENE. Prior to the incident, COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) did not notice anything out of the ordinary. Sometime during one of the briefings, COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) gave MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) his camera to take photographs. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) heard what sounded like an AK-47, but did not see it. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) related no one was designated as a Guardian Angel; however, they did have PSD personnel along with PSO's, and Danish Security. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) didn't recall any Afghanistan personnel acting odd.

About 2050, 6 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) regarding the incident at the Afghanistan National Defense University (ANDU). COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) believed the event was organized by CPT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (NFI) from Camp Qargha. Aside from the personal protection teams assigned to the generals, he believed the Danish

were in charge of security at the event. The meeting at ANDU was to discuss a water issue as well as the continued coalition-led construction of the ANDU compound. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) believed the first meeting at ANDU provided an introduction to the site and started at approximately 0945, 5 Aug 14. The venue was right outside the Camp Qargha compound. The group moved to the second site (a water tower on the ANDU compound) and discussed the water issues. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated this site was fairly close to the ANDU firing range. They moved to the third site, which took them to a bunker along the edge of the ANDU compound. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) believed each site briefing lasted approximately 45 minutes, and he thought they arrived at the bunker around 1100. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) believed only part of their group went into the bunker and the others stayed out where the shooting occurred. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated an impromptu briefing from Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (NFI) started when they returned from the bunker. Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) set up an easel and the crowd of people gathered around him in a horseshoe formation as he briefed. The General Officers stood in the front of the horseshoe formation. The briefing at this location was not scheduled and no one knew it was going to take place. Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) finished his brief and everyone was standing around discussing the water issues when the shooting began. The first few shots hit the ground, because he saw dust fly up, then they started hitting people in the crowd. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) ran behind a concrete wall and he could not identify where the shots originated. Several rounds were fired, then there was a small pause and several more rounds were fired. The firing sounded like very quick bursts, but COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) did not know exactly how many rounds were fired. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated once the firing stopped, he and CPT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) started to treat Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) who was shot in the leg. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) informed SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) that the only Soldiers who were wearing body armor during the attack were the security team members. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated the others did not wear armor while on the ANDU compound because they wanted to show trust to their Afghanistan counterparts. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) saw several ANA Soldiers at the site, but he did not notice if they had weapons.

About 2130, 6 Aug 14, FSO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) coordinated with Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) CI Analyst, KAIA, and obtained one compact disc (CD) and three digital video discs (DVD). A review of the CD revealed it contained death scene photographs taken by CI personnel on 5 Aug 14 at the incident location. A review of one of the DVDs revealed it was photographs taken by a Dynacorp photographer who was present when the incident occurred. The second DVD contained video footage from the Australian go pro cameras in use by security personnel on the roof of the barracks building. The third DVD contained dash cam video footage and pictures provided by the German PSD element. (See CD and three DVDs for details)

About 2300, 6 Aug 14, FSO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) obtained Tazkera printouts regarding RAFIQULLAH and a couple of the individuals incarcerated at Sia Sang as a result of this incident. The printouts were provided by Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (See Printouts for details)

About 1055, 7 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) completed Canvass Interview Worksheets with the following individuals:

Agent's Comments: They did not identify the shooter, nor did they return fire. SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated he was one of the first individuals to help treat MG GREENE's wounds following the shooting. SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated MG GREENE went down during the initial burst of fire, and he ran straight to him to check on his condition. MG GREENE was unresponsive and appeared to have a concave in his forehead, a gunshot in his neck and a gunshot in his back. SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated they got him into a vehicle with MG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and exited the area. SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) twisted his ankle at some point during the incident, but didn't notice it until later on, once the adrenal wore off. (See Canvass Interview Worksheets for details)

About 1200, 7 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) DODID: (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) 258th MP CO, ISAF, who related CPT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) UTAG, Qargha (NFI), coordinated all the security for the events with the Danish personnel. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) related the Afghanistan Generals and other personnel were in uniform; however, they did not have weapons or armor on. After they went to the water pump adjacent to the barb wire and wall walkway, they were coming back to their vehicles when the impromptu briefing happened. The final briefing was not supposed to take place there, and was not on the schedule. All the officer aids took hits first, and then MG GREENE took a hit. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) related after MG GREENE was hit, they grabbed everyone and made their way to the main LZ where the medical helicopters were called in to MEDEVAC the injured out. During the incident, 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) heard an entire clip or two of rounds going off from the attacker; however, he did not witness where it came from. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) also did not know who engaged the attacker. Prior to the incident, all the Afghanistan people on Qargha appeared oblivious to their presence. There was also nothing odd about their demeanor. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was MG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) PSO and was preparing to move to the next location via text messages with his PSD elements when the shooting started. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) sent his last text around 1153, 5 Aug 14, and the shooting started a couple minutes after that. At the time, they had no known threats; however, once the mission began, 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and his PSD element believed the biggest threat was the on-going range on Qargha, where ANA Soldiers were firing M16 rifles. Several minutes prior to the incident, the Danish security team cleared the building. (See Canvass Interview Worksheet for details)

About 1234, 7 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) obtained a hand drawn sketch of the incident from 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) along with pictures of their walkthrough. (See Sketch and photographs for details)

About 1246, 7 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) obtained a Canvass Interview Worksheet of SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) DODID: (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) 258th MP CO, ISAF, who related he did not see the shooter or witness the incident, as he was with all the vehicles. (See Canvass Interview Worksheet for details)

About 1615, 7 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) obtained signed statements from SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) CPL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) LCPL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and LCPL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Service Number: (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) DMOD MAG CPT, HQ, ISAF. A review of the sworn statements revealed the following information:

1. SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was the Close Protection Team Leader of DMOD MAG team and was tasked to provide security for MG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) in Afghanistan. On 5 Aug 14, they were providing security at Qargha, and SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) did not notice anything unusual about the Afghan personnel in the area. SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated the fourth briefing was in an enclosed building containing a water tank, and only MG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) CPT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and CPL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Service Number: (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) DMOD MAG CPT, HQ, ISAF, were present during the incident. SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and the rest of his team were stationed in or near their vehicles which were approximately 75 meters north of where the incident took place. Around 1155, 5 Aug 14, SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) heard bursts of small arms fire coming from the area of the briefing, at which time he and his team moved to engage and extract MG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C). Upon arrival to the scene CPL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) extracted MG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) utilizing one of their vehicles, and SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) went to the aid of CPT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) who was shot in his lower left leg, left elbow, and right hip. SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and his team then took CPT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) to the MEDEVAC point. (See Statement for details)

(b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and the rest of the team approached the area and extracted their people from the area. (See Statement for details)

5. LCPL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Service # (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) DMOD MAG CPT, ISAF, stated he was in his vehicle when heard a burst of automatic gunfire, turned and looked in the direction of the congregation, and heard another burst of gunfire along with observing bullet rounds hit the ground near the congregation. LCPL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and the rest of the team approached the area and extracted their people. After the incident occurred, he escorted several people back to the incident, and entered the "U" shaped building. As LCPL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) entered the building, he was escorted immediately to the right, and again to the right, and entered the third room on the left which appeared to be a latrine. There were other people in the room, and on the floor was an Afghan male, wearing an ANA uniform and appeared to have been shot several times. There were bullet holes in the window directly next to him. LCPL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated he did not see a weapon; however, due to the amount of people in the room he could not discern if there was one or not. (See Statement for details)

About 1630, 7 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) obtained MG GREENE's overseas death certificate, which detailed MG GREENE dies from multiple gunshot wounds. (See Overseas Death Certificate for details)

About 2030, 7 Aug 14, FSO (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) coordinated with Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) who provided one CD, which contained photos taken by the Danish PSD element who secured the scene immediately following the attack. The photos depicted the death scene and the shooter's body. (See CD for details)

About 0855, 8 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) obtained interview notes from SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) BAF CI, BAF regarding the joint interviews they conducted with the BAF CID office on 6 Aug 14. (See Interview Notes for details)

About 0950, 8 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed Dr. (MAJ) (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (United Kingdom), Camp Qargha Hospital, who related she was the head doctor treating the injured after the incident. MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) also treated MG GREENE when he arrived to the Landing Zone near Camp Qargha. MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) believed she observed a gunshot wound to MG GREENE's head and another wound to the lower right side of his neck. The wound on the neck was substantial and could have been the exit wound. MG GREENE showed no signs of life and it was apparent he was deceased; however, they still tried to save him with nine rounds of CPR. MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was told there was a gunshot wound on MG GREENE's back, but she did not assess it because her first mission was to restore his breathing. MG GREENE's pelvic area was consistent with trauma, but MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) did not think it would have been dislocated by falling to the ground. She believed there was probably some sort of trauma to his back. MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) did not typically call time of death, but this time she had no choice and called his Time of Death as 1304, 5 Aug 14. It was obvious there was nothing she or the other doctors could do for MG GREENE, and they needed to move on and treat the others who were injured during the shooting. MAJ (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) related MG GREENE was most likely dead at the scene of the incident.

About 1110, 8 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) DODID: (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) USACE Trans-Atlantic District, NKC, who related the incident occurred around noon, on 5 Aug 14. SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) did not notice anything out of the ordinary, and all of the Afghanistan Generals appeared relaxed as they dropped their body armor with the other Generals. SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was present to provide protection services to LTC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and was adjacent to him in the "U" shaped briefing, when the incident occurred. SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was nearest to the building the shooter was in, when he heard what he believed was an "explosion" first and then gunfire out of the window. SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) then fired about eight rounds into the window where the gunfire was coming from. The gunfire from the window continued and was fully automatic. SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) related SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) returned fire after being hit, with two rounds from his M-4 before it jammed, and then several rounds from his pistol. SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) related SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) sustained injuries to his left forearm, left foot, right leg, and fragments to his shoulders. SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) related the doctors pulled 4-5 bullets out of him.

About 1115, 8 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) obtained Canvass Interview Worksheet of LTC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) DODID: (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) USACE Trans-Atlantic District, NKC. LTC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) sustained a gunshot wound to his shoulder, and fragments struck his right elbow. LTC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) did not see the attacker. The attackers' gunfire was over in seconds and appeared to be one long continuous burst. LTC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) only observed SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) return fire to someone in a window. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) returned fire after he was hit.

About 1305, 8 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (Denmark), Officer in Charge, U-TAG Protective Mobility Cell, Camp Qarqha, Afghanistan, who related he was the overall tactical commander for the security at the event. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) coordinated the security with two American PSD teams, who came out to advance the site. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated on the day of the attack, they did not anticipate stopping at that site, so after people started returning from the bunker site, he sent part of his security element to the final site (Afghan General's home) to secure it. A few minutes later, the group of people standing outside of the barracks was engaged with gunfire. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) turned his head to the left because he could not determine where the firing originated, then he turned to right and saw the barrel of a weapon sticking halfway out of a window. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) believed the weapon looked like an M-16 rifle. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) fired his weapon and missed the window, so he walked his rounds left and started firing through the window. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) fired a few rounds, when he heard someone behind him start firing at the window as well. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) believed the weapon was able to fire several rounds of bursts (7-10 bursts). 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) related the weapon withdrew from the window after they fired at it, so he went around the corner to enter the building. When he went inside, 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) saw a group of ANA soldiers standing around with their weapons. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) did not know who the individual firer was, so he did not want to go into the building by himself. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) tried a second time once he found an American Soldier, but there were even more ANA in the building. He went back out and grabbed one more American Soldier and another man from his security detail, PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (Denmark) (NFI), and cleared the building. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated they went into the bathroom and found the body of an ANA Soldier in the back room away from the window the shots came from. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) noticed a couple of ANA Soldiers with weapons in the room when he came in. he ordered his men to pull him out and attempt first aid. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) went back outside and informed COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (NFI) the shooter was identified and the threat was neutralized. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) went back in and PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) told him the man had no pulse and was dead. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) checked his pulse and was unable to find one, so he ordered PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) to guard the room and body and to take photographs of the area with his phone. BG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) arrived a few minutes later with a British QRF element and ordered them to clear the scene, which they did. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated there was no weapon with the body, when he entered the room and the shooter's body armor was removed from the body and set aside. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) noticed blood on the upper portion of the man's body but could not tell where the bullet holes were in his body. When they secured the area, several senior ANA officers came to the scene and all of them looked surprised and disgusted at the man who was lying on the ground. Additionally, 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated one of the ANA officers kicked the man in the head with a look of disgust on his face.

Agent's Comments: 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated his personal opinion was they had wounded the man when they shot at him, but he believed ANA Soldiers shot and killed him from inside the bathroom. 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) could not recall hearing shots after the weapon withdrew from the window.

About 1410, 8 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Badge Number: (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) CTSC-A, CJ-Eng, ISAF. Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) related he injured his back after he fled the scene of the incident. Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) related he took shelter in an adjacent building and attempted to exit through a window by jumping out of it. When he jumped out of it, he fell and injured his back.

About 1520, 8 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) interviewed PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) U-TAG Protective Mobility Cell, Camp Qargha, Afghanistan, who stated he was part of 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) security detail on 5 Aug 14. PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was working as an advance team member and would leave the venue locations and move on to the next location once he received the word from 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C). PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) told three men from the security detail to move to the final venue about 5 minutes before the shooting started. PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated just after he arrived at the General's house (site 5), he heard some gun shots and then heard one of his team members come across the radio and say there was a shooting, so he returned to the site. PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated the building was only 1-2 minutes from the General's house, and when he arrived he linked up with 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) who wanted him to find an interpreter to go into the building. PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) went up on the roof of the building and grabbed an interpreter, then linked up with 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and two American PSD soldiers in uniform. PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) went into the building. PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) saw approximately 15 Afghan Soldiers inside the main room and most had rifles. PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) found the body of one ANA soldier lying on the floor, propped up on the wall in the back far hallway adjacent to the main room. PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) observed four Afghan soldiers in the room and at least two had rifles. PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) stated they cleared them out of the room and then 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) told them to drag the body out and try to save the soldier. took photographs of the body and the scene, but stated he did not observe the location of the gunshot wounds on the ANA soldier's body. PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) believed the bullets were all in his upper torso due to the pattern of blood on the soldier's clothing. There was a lot of blood on the soldier's upper left shoulder and then throughout the chest area. PFC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) secured the area for about 10-15 minutes, then 1LT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) came in and said they were leaving. Tuesday 05 August 2014

I am (b)(6)(b)(7)(C). I am currently employed as Close Protection Team Leader of DMOd MAG CP team currently tasked with the protection of Maj Gen (b)(6)(b)(7)(C). I have held this position since Jun 14.

On 05 Aug 14, I was on task along with my team at the Afghan National Army Officer Academy (ANAOA) / Afghan National Defence University where our Principle was attending a series of briefing stands relating to the infrastructure of the aforementioned institutions.

About 1145 hrs, that day, my team, along with the Principle, his interpreter and his Aide-De-Camp, Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) WG moved to the fourth serial on the days programme, a brief on a subterranean water tank at grid 42S WD 05304 22459. Due to the large numbers of personnel attending the briefing and the enclosed nature of the water tank we were instructed that only essential personnel were to attend. Maj Gen (b)(6)(b)(7)(C), Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and the Body Guard, Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) went to the area the briefing was to take place and our Personal Escort Section (PES) and VIP vehicle remained on the road approx. 75m North of where the briefing was taking place.

About 1155 hrs, I was in the PES vehicle, along with Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C), LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) when I heard bursts of small arms fire from the area where the briefing was taking place and saw people taking cover. I heard Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) shout 'CONTACT' and heard a PRR message from the BG stating the same and that he had been hit. LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) then exited the vehicle and ran toward the contact point using the vehicle as a screen as the vehicle drove to the contact point. The VIP vehicle, driven by Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) followed behind.

Upon arrival at the contact point I ran to the edge of a building which overlooked the contact point and saw a number of casualties on the ground including Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C). I identified where the BG and Maj Gen (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) were and shouted at them to get into the VIP Vehicle. They ran to the vehicle and embussed and the vehicle extracted to Camp Qargha. I then ran to where Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) lay on the ground and was being tended to by LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C). Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) had sustained a gunshot wound to his lower left leg, his left elbow and his right hip. He was in pain and was asking for pain relief. LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) administered an morphine auto injector to Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and I said we needed to get Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) into the PES vehicle to extract him from the scene and get him back to Role 1 Med at Camp Qargha. LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C), LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C), an unknown US officer and I then lifted Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) into the rear of the PES vehicle and extracted him to Role 1 Med. Whilst driving to Role 1 Med, LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and I attempted to carry out further first aid to Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C).

Upon arrival at Role 1 Med, LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and I, along with two med personnel carried Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) into the treatment area on a stretcher and handed over the MIST report to (b)(6)(b)(7)(C).

I am (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) M D, AGC (RMP), and I am currently employed as the second in command of the DMOD MAG CPT team tasked with the protection of Maj Gen (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) a possession I have held since Jun 14.

I will go on to describe the following place. The subterranean water storage plant within QARGAH camp and the Afghan national officer training academy located at grid, GR 42S WD 0531 2247. The location to be visited was about 10 – 20 meters from an entry control point and was overlooked by a U shaped two story building. From where w I was located in the Teams Silver Toyota Land cruiser I could see the eastern and northern edge of the U shaped building and was about 50 – 60 meters from the main congregation for the visit. We were slightly elevated and north to the building was a metaled road I could clearly see about a third of the group as they were in a court yard area that was obscured from my view.

I was in the vehicle with Sgt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) all team members of DMOD MAG CPT. Approximately 1130hrs I heard a burst of what I believed to be automatic weapons fire and saw rounds splashing in and around the group of visitors to the water treatment plant. I then said contact and LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) debussed from the vehicle. I then drove the vehicle down the metaled road approximately 50- 60 meters to the contact point. I could clearly see three US personal taking cover next to a small wall situated on the southern edge of the road. I then drove next to them and stopped the vehicle where Sgt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) debussed from the vehicle and moved to the wall. I could see Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) ADC to Maj Gen (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) laying on the courtyard he appeared to have been shot. I was unaware of where he had been hit. I then looked to my front to try and identify the contact point where I saw Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) leading Maj General (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) to the VIP vehicle that was situated to my rear. Sgt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) then told the VIP Vehicle to extract to Camp Qargha as Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) had been wounded and to remove Maj Gen (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) to safety. LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) then dressed forward with a medical kit and started to treat Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Sgt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) also dressed forward to assist. There were roughly 15-20 ISAF forces in the area and after initial treatment Sgt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and an unknown American carried Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) to the vehicle and dragged him into the back seat of the PES vehicle. LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) then started to apply pressure to the wounds sustained due to the contact. Sgt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was assisting from the front seat. LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) held onto the off side running boards on the external of the vehicle and the interpreter was in the boot of the vehicle. I then reversed the vehicle and conducted a Y turn and drove the PES vehicle with all PAX to the British medical facility at Camp Qargha. Upon Arriving I then debussed with the rest of the team and assisted with extracting Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) from the vehicle with other members of the team and a female medic who I cannot recall.

I then moved the vehicle to a parking area in order to let other teams to bring casualties to the Medical Facility.

I am (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) AGC (RMP), currently deployed on OP HERRICK as part of the DMOD MAG CP Team. A position I have held since 22 Jun 14.

On Tue 5 Aug 14, I was tasked as VIP driver for Maj Gen (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) DMOD MAG. During which I was tasked to an NTM(A) event at MFNDU, where a high profile visit was being conducted with members of other nations.

About 1100 hrs, that day, the congregation arrived at a water pumping plant within the MFNDU to be shown the building. I parked my vehicle at a T-Junction approximately 50 meters away from where the briefing was ongoing with the Personal Escort Section (PES) vehicle containing members of the CP Team were. I was not facing the briefing as I was just off the road in which the briefing was on, however I could see the meeting to my left. The meeting was taking place on the opposite side of cream single story building which had a large concreted area in which the all of the congregation were standing. On top of the building I saw several armed NATO soldiers. Down the far side of the concreted area was a high Hesco Bastion wall and down the other side was the road which had T-Walls down the centre of it, as if it was a check point. The road leading to the water pumping facility was at a steep decline therefore my vehicle was parked in an elevated location.

About 1130 hrs, that day, I heard two bursts of gunfire of approx 5 rounds each. Hearing this I looked at the meeting place and then heard another burst of gunfire of approx 5 rounds and could see ground splash around by now where members of the congregation laying down wounded. The PES vehicle drove down the road towards the concreted area. I followed behind the PES vehicle and stopped short of the building. It was at this point that I could see Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) ADC, DMOD MAG, laying wounded in the centre of the concreted area as well as other wounded people.

I then heard Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) state over PRR that Maj Gen (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was uninjured however he had been hit.

I then looked to my left and witnessed a male wearing a dark green digital patterned ANA soldier's uniform and a red beret carrying a large machine gun running away from the cream building in the opposite direction of the road.

At this point, I saw Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and Maj Gen (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) running up the road on the opposite side of the T-Walls, towards my vehicle. I shouted for them to get in, to which they did and Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and I extracted Maj Gen (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) to Camp Qargha which is located within the same complex.

Statement of Witness.

I am (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) a member of DMoD MAG Close Protection Team (CPT) and have been since 22 June 14.

On Tue 5 Aug 14, about 1155 hrs, I was sat in the Personal Escort Section (PES) Vehicle which was placed at a T-Junction facing the congregation of VIP's including Maj Gen (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (our VIP) that was receiving a brief about a water pump facility about 40 meters to our front but slightly left. Just before this area was an off white 1 story building that I can remember seeing numerous Afghan National Army soldiers entering and exiting whilst the brief was taking place. I was in the PES vehicle with Sgt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C), Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) all fellow members of DMoD MAG CPT, when I heard a burst of automatic gunfire approximately 4-7 rounds, in the area of which the congregation were receiving their brief. This drew my attention straight away to the area and I heard another burst of automatic gunfire again about 4-7 rounds, this time I could also see bullet splash on the ground in the vicinity of the congregation. I did not see where the rounds were fired from. At the time the rounds were being fired, Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) drove the vehicle forward about 35 meters to the area that the rounds were landing so we could get our VIP (Maj Gen (b)(6)(b)(7)(C)) into the vehicle and into safety. Once at the incident point, I debussed from the right hand side of our vehicle and assessed the area around me to which I saw numerous casualties. I then saw LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) administering morphine to Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) who was layed on his back. There was a lot of confusion amongst the congregation as nobody seemed to know where the shots were fired from or who fired them. I then ran towards LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) to assist but at this stage we decided to extract Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) to Role 1 Medical at Camp Qargha. LCpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C), Sgt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) an American soldier and I then lifted Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) to the rear seats of the PES vehicle. PES vehicle then extracted to Camp Qargha with myself administering further treatment to Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) on the rear seats. On arrival to the Role 1 Medical I then assisted with putting Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) on to a stretcher and getting him into treatment room.

Statement of Witness

I am (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) SW, AGC (RMP), British Army, I have been employed as part of DMoD MAG Close Protection Team looking after Major General (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Welsh Guards, since 22 Jun 14.

On 05 Aug 14, I was part of the CP team escorting MG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) around Afghan National Defense University, along with Sg (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and Cpl (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) (Body Guard). MG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was part of a congregation of other Generals, Multi-nationality, along with their CP Teams. Around 0930 hrs we arrived at the location. We moved around various parts of the site before finally arriving at the location of the incident at around 1140hrs. I was part of the Personal Escort Section that was positioned on a T Junction approximately 75 metres from where the brief was taking place and had a clear view of the party. From our vehicle the congregation of Generals where at the bottom of a slight hill with a barrier half way down and a metal gate at the bottom, there were buildings on the right and a lone building on the left, the incident took place between the building on the left and the metal gate at the bottom of the hill, the building on the left was where the gunman fired from which I will later describe. Approximately 1155hrs, whilst sat in the vehicle I heard multiple bursts (3-4 five round bursts) of automatic gunfire from the direction of the group, I looked at their location and saw a lot of dust from the splash of the rounds impacting the crowd as a number of personnel hit the floor and dived for cover. I immediately dismounted from the vehicle and ran towards the incident site. As I got to the location I was not sure on the location of the gunman, so I took cover behind a vehicle, before removing the Medical Kit. Once it was confirmed the gunman had been killed I moved towards the crowd where I saw an unknown amount of individuals lay on the floor wounded. I immediately began to administer first aid to Captain (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) the ADC to MG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) when I examined him I found he had a gunshot wound to his right elbow, left shin and right hip/pelvis, due to his pain I administered morphine at 1200 hrs, I then helped move Capt (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) to one of our vehicles where we drove him to Camp Quarga Medical Centre. Around 1230 hrs, I was tasked to escort Brigadier (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Scottish Guards Regiment, British Army, back to the site of the incident. On arrival at the site the QRF had secured the area, we moved towards the site of the actual shooting and all personnel were gone all that remained where a number of medical items lay around the floor. Myself and Brigadier (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) were escorted by a Danish soldier into a "U" shape building on the left, approximately 5 metres from the shooting site, as we entered the building we turned right and immediately right again, we entered the third room on the left, which I believe was a toilet. There were a number of people in this room and I saw 1 male, wearing Afghan National Army clothing dead of gunshot wounds on the floor. There were a number of bullet holes in the window directly next to him. I didn't see his weapon as the room was quite small (1metre x 2 metres) and the amount of people in the room blocked my view. We then visited the ANAOA HQ, before making our way back to Camp Quarga. I had no further dealings with this incident.

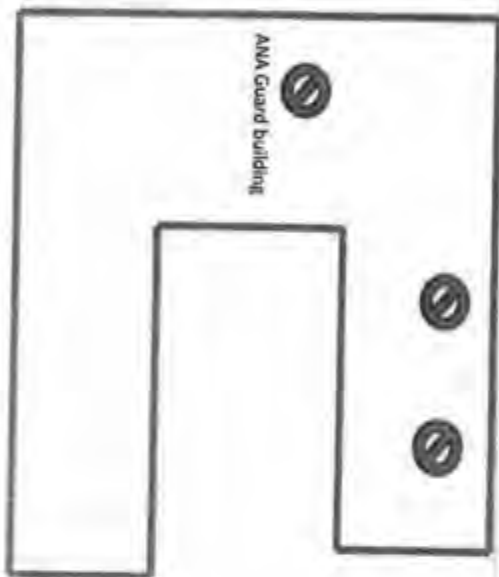

DETAILS

About 1515, 12 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) obtained several documents through the Safe Access File Exchange (SAFE) website from Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Office of Counsel, Transatlantic Afghanistan District, USACE, BAF. Mr. (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) provided aerial photographs of the MFNDU and sworn statements from USACE personnel. A review of the documents revealed the following:

1. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) provided a typed statement and an aerial photograph diagram, which detailed the incident location. COL (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) attended the briefing at MFNDU and was present at the site when the shooting began. When the shooting started, he was immediately hit in his hand, and once he realized what was going on, he dropped to the ground and low crawled away from the direction of the gunfire. (See Statement and diagram for details)
2. LTC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) provided a typed statement and a diagram of the incident location. He attended the briefings at the MFNDU and was present when the shooting began, wherein he sustained injuries. (See Statement and diagram for details)
3. SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) provided a statement, a diagram of the incident location, and an aerial photograph of the MFNDU. SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was part of the security team for the USACE Soldiers and was in a parked vehicle when the shooting began. (See Statement, diagram, and aerial photograph for details)
4. SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) provided a statement, two power point slides labeled BFC CONOP, two diagrams of the incident location, and two aerial photographs of the MFNDU with briefing locations. SSG (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was present during the shooting and sustained a gunshot wound. He returned fire and assisted one of the wounded Soldiers by applying a pressure dressing to the Soldier's buttocks area. (See Statement, BFC CONOP slides, diagrams of the incident location, and aerial photographs for details)
5. SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) provided two statements, a diagram of the incident location and two aerial photographs of the MFNDU which showed the incident location and briefing sites. SGT (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was present at the time of the shooting, but he was positioned with the vehicles away from the gunfire. (See Statements, diagram, and aerial photographs for details)
6. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) provided a statement, a diagram of the incident location, and two aerial photographs of the area. SPC (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) was at MFNDU at the time of the incident but was with the vehicles when the shooting started. (See Statement, diagram, and aerial photographs for details)

GREENE, DODI# 1023196731, Combined Security Transition Team-Afghanistan, APO, Armed Forces Africa, Canada, Europe and Middle East, 09320.

About 1130, 7 Aug 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) attended the autopsy of MG GREENE, Medical Examiner's # 14-0230. The autopsy was conducted by Dr. (CPT) (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Deputy Medical Examiner, U.S. Navy and Dr. (CPT) (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) Associate Medical Examiner, U.S. Army, both U. S. Army Medical Research & Materiel Command, Armed Forces Medical Examiner Systems (AFMES), 115 Purple Heart Drive, Dover Air Force Base, DE 19902 (DAFB). BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: This office received a Request for Assistance (RFA) from the 502nd MP BN (CID), Bagram Airfield Afghanistan, APO AE 09354, to interview Protected Entity 2706970-0042-2014-CID019 (PE) regarding their knowledge of a Green on Blue incident which occurred in Kabul, Afghanistan.

About 1310, 12 Sep 14, SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) and SA (b)(6)(b)(7)(C) this office, interviewed the PE who stated he was MG GREENE's aide and was unsure of exactly where the incident took place. PE related earlier in the day MG GREENE, was briefing Afghan Army personnel on how the water problem they were experiencing was not a coalition problem, but an Afghan problem. PE related after the briefing, the debate got heated between MG GREENE and the German General (NFI). PE related then after MG GREENE and the Germany General exchanged words, an Afghan General (NFI) stated to MG GREENE he disapproved of what he said and walked away from MG GREENE. PE related as the Afghan General walked away, he stopped and whispered something into another Afghan soldier's ear. PE related later on that morning they moved to separate area where MG GREENE was going another site, which was located in the same area. PE related upon arrival, MG GREENE got out of the vehicle first, which was not a normal occurrence. PE related he noticed that MG GREENE had exited the vehicle and got out ensure MG GREENE's security. PE related when he exited the vehicle, he immediately looked for MG GREENE's PSD team or any security but did not see anyone. PE related a moment later, he heard a gunshot and then looked at MG GREENE and his face looked "helpless". PE related he heard more gunshots and felt one hit him, making him fall to ground. PE related he looked up and saw MG GREENE's on the ground next to him, apparently deceased. PE related about three days before the mission to this location, he was in contact with a CPT in the Reserves whose name he could not recall. PE related the CPT was sending sensitive information over an unclassified network regarding MG GREENE's movements. PE related he informed the CPT to cease distribution, but the CPT did not. PE related that all movements involving MG GREENE were classified and no one had any information on any movements. PE related when MG GREENE and his entourage arrived at the incident site, there was a lot of activity going on that was unusual from past visits. PE related there was a Physical Fitness Test going on and a live fire range as well. PE related they had visited this site before and usually it is a "ghost town".
