MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Extraordinary achievements in covert operations; established and supervised a successful Criminal Information Section that was able to strike at the heart of the drug threat in Frankfurt, Germany.

Authored the first ever CID Polygraph Policy and Procedures Manual, which is still being used today.

Pushed the CID Polygraph Program to the forefront of computerized technology; instrumental in converting from mechanical to computerized polygraph instruments, and went on to develop applications that assisted examiners in the performance of their duties.

Throughout his career, he conducted 1,078 polygraph examinations; no one in CID history has conducted more. He was selected as the first ever Civilian Chief of Polygraph.

Considered to be the world-renowned expert in the field of polygraph. His leadership skills and unrivaled technical expertise were evident in the mentorship he provided, and left an indelible mark on agents and examiners.
