MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Best known for his tenure on the USACIDC Inspector General team as the Senior Special Agent Inspector where he was firm but fair and the “Keeper of the Command’s investigative standards.” He had a Command-wide reputation as a very effective teacher and trainer.

He utilized his Senior Special Agent Inspector duties to identify operational strengths and weaknesses at the CID office level and bring them back to the Command to create the first Command Special Agent-in-Charge course of which he was the principal instructor.

In 1980, he successfully negotiated the release of hostages from a banking facility on a Kaserne in Germany during a botched bank robbery.

He held positions of increased responsibility all the way from Team Chief to Group Operations Officer in his 30 years of military service before his retirement in 1996.
