Major Accomplishments:

- While in Vietnam, he worked over 140 cases including the “fragging” murder of a MP Commander and 1SG and an SF Soldier selling untraceable weapons to the enemy.
- Instrumental in the identification and apprehension of a Special Forces Officer who found, and subsequently laundered, hundreds of thousands of dollars.
- Involved in the identification and apprehension of three Soldiers who perpetrated a double murder, a rape, and a robbery.
- Served as the SAC for the CID Office established to support the International Olympics in Munich, Germany.
- Played a significant role in establishing the Warrant Officer professional development process and finalizing the CW5 position for the Army.
