VACANCY ANNOUNCEMENT

ASSISTANT SPECIAL AGENT-IN-CHARGE (ASAC)

BACKGROUND

As the Department of the Army's only federal criminal investigative organization, Army CID is responsible for conducting felony-level criminal investigations impacting Army people, programs, resources, and capabilities worldwide. Army CID is also a Personal Protection Organization which provides executive protection for Department of Defense and Department of the Army senior leaders.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- U.S. Citizen or naturalized U.S. Citizen.
- Ability to obtain and maintain a Top Secret clearance.
- Bachelors Degree from an accredited institution with a GPA of 2.95 or higher preferred.
- Possess a valid motor vehicle operators license at the time of appointment, must maintain license while employed in the position and will be required to operate a motor vehicle.
- Be no older than 37 years of age at the time of entry on duty (exceptions are preference eligible veterans and those currently covered under the 6C Federal Law Enforcement retirement system).

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Army CID is seeking a strong leader to serve as an ASAC who is experienced in planning, developing, and coordinating criminal investigations; planning and directing investigative support operations; and providing investigative guidance to subordinate criminal investigators.

DUTIES:

Through consultation with the SAC, establishes the basic long-term investigative objectives of the assigned area of responsibility

Provide uniform interpretation and application of laws, orders, rules, and regulations pertaining to general crimes.

Collaborate with other field office supervisors and managers, headquarters staff and various federal intelligence and law enforcement agencies to negotiate, decide on, and coordinate work-related changes affecting related investigations.

Plan, prepare, coordinate, and present briefings to high-ranking DA and DoD management officials.

Supervise, manage, and direct activities of assigned personnel to enable them to successfully conduct investigations and operations.

ABOUT THE POSITION

LOCATIONS: Fort Bragg, NC; Fort Benning, GA; Schofield Barracks, HI; Fort Hood, TX; Fort Riley, KS; Kaiserslautern, Germany

NOTE: This solicitation is open to CURRENT GS-1811-13s and 14s ONLY.

- Appointment subject to a suitability or fitness determination, as determined by a completed background investigation.
- Must agree in writing to comply with management-directed permanent change of station movement to meet mission requirements.
- Must qualify with and carry a firearm.
- Must pass urinalysis testing as required prior to appointment and periodically thereafter. Position is subject to random drug testing.
- Must have completed the Army CID Basic Special Agent Course, Federal Law Enforcement Training Center, Criminal Investigator Training Program, or equivalent prior to or within 1 year following employment. Failure to do so will result in removal from employment.
- This position is subject to the Lautenberg Amendment/Domestic Violence Misdemeanor Amendment to the Gun Control Act of 1968.
- A medical examination for Criminal Investigation Series 1811 is required.
- Permanent Change of Station allowance and/or Recruitment Incentive and/or Relocation Incentive may be authorized, subject to the provisions of the Joint Travel Regulation and an agency determination that a PCS move is in the Government's best interest.
- This position is eligible for Law Enforcement Availability Pay (LEAP) of 25% of base salary. Receipt of LEAP requires an average of two additional hours per duty day of availability/work.
- This position is included under the provisions of Special Retirement Coverage and may have both a maximum entry age and a mandatory retirement date.
