SPECIAL AGENT PROGRAM

(GS-1811 grades 07 & 09 CONUS Locations only)

Background

As the Department of the Army's only federal criminal investigative organization, Army CID is responsible for conducting felony-level criminal investigations impacting Army people, programs, resources, and capabilities worldwide.

Army CID is also a Personal Protection Organization which provides executive protection for Department of Defense and Department of the Army senior leaders.

About the Program

Serve as a Criminal Investigator responsible for conducting and/or overseeing investigations of suspected felony violations against the laws of the United States and the Uniform Code of Military Justice in which Army people, communities, programs, or resources are impacted.

Participate in large scale joint and task force felony criminal investigations having national or international jurisdictional or media interest.

Plan, lead, and participate in significant and potentially dangerous undercover functions to include undercover surveillance and 'sting' operations.

Review and prepare interim and/or final reports of felony criminal investigations. Consolidate and evaluate incoming criminal information, identifying necessary investigative and data collection follow-up actions to be initiated.

Eligibility Requirements

- U.S. Citizen or naturalized U.S. Citizen.
- Ability to obtain and maintain a Top Secret clearance.
- Bachelors Degree from an accredited institution with a GPA of 2.95 or higher
- Possess a valid motor vehicle operators license at the time of appointment, must maintain license while employed in the position and will be required to operate a motor vehicle.
- Be no older than 37 years of age at the time of entry on duty (exceptions are preference eligible veterans and those currently covered under the 6C Federal Law Enforcement retirement system)

About the Position

- Appointment subject to a suitability or fitness determination, as determined by a completed background investigation.
- Must agree in writing to comply with management-directed permanent change of station movement to meet mission requirements.
- Must qualify with and carry a firearm.
- Must pass urinalysis testing as required prior to appointment and periodically thereafter. Position is subject to random drug testing.
- Must have completed the Army CID Basic Special Agent Course, Federal Law Enforcement Training Center, Criminal Investigator Training Program, or equivalent prior to or within 1 year following employment. Failure to do so will result in removal from employment.
- This position is subject to the Lautenberg Amendment/Domestic Violence Misdemeanor Amendment to the Gun Control Act of 1968.
- A medical examination for Criminal Investigation Series 1811 is required.
- Permanent Change of Station allowance and/or Recruitment Incentive and/or Relocation Incentive may be authorized, subject to the provisions of the Joint Travel Regulation and an agency determination that a PCS move is in the Government's best interest.
- This position is eligible for Law Enforcement Availability Pay (LEAP) of 25% of base salary. Receipt of LEAP requires an average of two additional hours per duty day of availability/work.
- This position is included under the provisions of Special Retirement Coverage and may have both a maximum entry age and a mandatory retirement date.
