Background

Army CID is the Department of the Army's only federal law enforcement agency, consisting of nearly 3,000 personnel assigned to 124 world-wide locations, responsible for felony criminal investigations and operations; war crimes and terrorism investigations, criminal intelligence collection and analysis; cybercrime investigations and operations; multi-dimensional forensic support; and protective service operations for the Secretary of Defense, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and other high-risk personnel.

About the Digital Forensics Program

Serve as a Digital Forensic Analyst (DFA) responsible for applying the full range of analytical knowledge, skills, and abilities in the forensic identification, examination, analysis, and reporting of data associated with CID criminal investigations.

Participate in large scale joint and task force investigations having national or international jurisdictional.

May work in ambiguous and rapidly evolving environments.

Review and prepare investigative reports to inform senior Army leaders on investigative findings and threats.

Eligibility Requirements

- **U.S. Citizen or naturalized U.S. Citizen**
- **Ability to obtain and maintain a Top-Secret clearance**
- **Bachelors Degree from an accredited institution, preferably with a focus in a digital forensics discipline**
- **Must pass urinalysis testing prior to appointment and periodically thereafter, including random drug testing**
- **Must have or obtain one of the following certifications: DoD DFE, CFCE, GCFE, GCFA, or equivalent.**
- **Preferred experience with the following tools: Cellebrite, GrayKey, Axiom, EnCase, X-Ways, Griffeye, Berla iVe**
- **Appointment subject to a suitability assessment determined by completed background investigation**

- Conduct forensic analysis of digital, electronic, and mobile device data which may contain evidence related to a criminal investigation
- Assist in discovery conferences with prosecutors and defense attorneys to verbally explain and discuss forensic findings
- Provide technical guidance to the investigative team and others before, during, and after investigations to ensure precautions are taken to prevent data and equipment damage
- Advise trial counsels and federal prosecutors on findings based on retrieved data, proceedings, discovery assistance, and determinations of compliance with laws and regulations
- Maintain liaison as it relates to forensic documentation with other federal agencies, the computer industry, etc. through participation in various meetings, training, seminars, and conferences
- Obtain access to electronic equipment, files, records, and databases by working under the legal authority of court orders, search authorizations, search warrants, and other legal processes
- Stay abreast of the latest information and technology available in the field of digital forensics by studying computer literature
- Position eligible for Retention Incentive of up to 10% base salary with qualifying training and certifications.
- Potential duty locations include Ft. Cavazos, TX; Ft. Liberty, NC; Joint Base Lewis-McChord, WA; Schofield Barracks, HI,
