The DoD's SkillBridge (also called "Career Skills") program is an opportunity for service members to gain valuable civilian work experience through specific industry training, apprenticeships, or internships. Military members can participate in SkillBridge during the last 180 days of their service.

DoD covers military pay and benefits during a service member's time in a SkillBridge program. The Army CID SkillBridge program provides an invaluable experience for service members to learn about the Army's federal law enforcement agency.

Requirements

- US Citizen
- Valid/current drivers license
- Able to obtain and maintain TS/SCI
- Pass a suitability background investigation

The Army CID Intern Program manager can assist in determining SkillBridge program prerequisites for various opportunities and enrollment protocols; however, written approval from unit commander of permanent assignment is required prior to commencement of training. Intern recruitment is centrally managed by Army CID Human Resources Directorate and the Intern Program Manager, and is supported by Army CID Field Offices.
