

CID Offers \$1,000 Reward in Attempted Abduction Case



QUANTICO, VA, Mar. 6, 2013 – The U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command, commonly referred to as CID, is offering a \$1,000 reward to anyone with information leading to the identification, arrest and conviction of an individual involved in an alleged attempted abduction of a child on Fort Hood, Texas.

The attempted abduction occurred on February 15, 2013, in the Kouma Village/Liberty Village area on Fort Hood.

The suspect is described as a black male in his late 40's to early 50's, approximately 5'10", average build, with a possible tattoo on the right side of his head. The suspect was seen driving a newer model, black four door sedan, possibly a Mercedes-Benz.
