The Department of the Army Criminal Investigation Division is offering a reward of up to \$25,000 for credible information leading to the recovery of Lorrene Debra Reynolds, or for information leading to the arrest of person(s) responsible for her disappearance.

Reynolds, 29 years old, was last seen at her residence on Hilldale Drive in Columbus, Georgia, on 21 June, 1985. Reynolds' 1979 Mazda RX-7 (silver) was discovered abandoned on 1 Feb, 1986, in the parking lot of the Atlanta Marriott Hotel adjacent to the Hartsfield Jackson International Airport in Atlanta. A search revealed Reynolds did not get onto a flight and her whereabouts remain unknown. Reynolds is described as a white female, 5 foot 5 inches tall, and approximately 120 pounds at the time of her disappearance. Reynolds worked as a sales consultant for Mary Kay cosmetics. Reynolds was also known to frequent the Al Who's Night Club in Columbus, Georgia. The Southern Field Office is working jointly with the Columbus Police Department on this case. No additional details can be provided at this time to retain the integrity of the investigation.
