The U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command is seeking qualified applicants to become highly-trained criminal investigators.

CID supports the Army in peacetime and during war. CID Special Agents receive the latest in law enforcement investigative training and perform professional criminal investigations worldwide, using state-of-the-art technology.

### **CID MISSION**

- » Investigate all felony crimes in which the Army has an interest including general crime (against persons or property), economic crime and counter-drug operations
- » Work closely with other federal law enforcement and intelligence agencies to combat terrorism and protect the force
- » Provide worldwide criminal investigative support to all U.S. Army elements
- » Conduct sensitive or special interest investigations as required or directed
- » Conduct protective service operations for Department of Defense, Joint Chiefs of Staff and Department of the Army officials
- » Provide forensic laboratory support for all Department of Defense investigative agencies

## WHAT TYPE OF TRAINING WILL I RECEIVE?

CID Special Agents are sworn Federal Law Enforcement Officers and their training includes:

- » U.S. Army CID Special Agent Course
- » Advanced training in specialized disciplines such as Protective Services; Child Abuse Prevention; Crisis/Hostage Negotiations; Advanced Crime Scene Investigative Techniques and Special Victims Unit Course
- » Opportunities to receive advanced training at the FBI National Academy, Scotland Yard Academy, the Canadian Police College and George Mason University to pursue a master's degree in forensic science

## WHAT ARE SOME OF THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR BECOMING A CID SPECIAL AGENT?

- » Must be a U.S. citizen
- » Minimum age of 21
- » Completed Basic Leader Course
- » Maximum grade of SGT
- » Minimum of two, maximum of 10 years of military service
- » Minimum of 60 college semester hours from an accredited institution
- » Minimum ST score of 107 and minimum GT score of 110
- » Consistently meet the height and weight standards prescribed in AR 600-9 and consistently pass the Army Physical Fitness Test
- » Ability to deploy worldwide, have no physical limitations and normal color vision
- » Must possess a valid driver's license and favorable driving record
- » Minimum of one year of military police experience or two years civilian police experience (May be waived for Active duty only)
